Potato Bar

If you've grown tired of endless spaghetti dinners, you can change things up with an all-you-can-eat potato bar

Everyone loves to compete...get prizes donated and charge an entrance fee

Smoothie Stand

A healthy and delicious twist on the traditional lemonade stand.

50/50 Raffle

Sell raffle tickets and offer half of the proceeds as prizes.

Potluck for Sale

Volunteers, family and friends donate homemade meals to sell.

Working at the Car Wash

Coordinate youth, teens and college students to wash cars during parent meetings, open houses, etc.

Blessings Jar

Ask your church, class, office, club or any organization you're involved in to take up a donation for Blessings in a Backpack. Provide them with a decorated jar (be creative) and call it a Blessings jar. Suggest a donation equal to the cost of a cup of coffee, a fast food meal, or a movie ticket. Collect gently used items to be sold at a garage sale.

In schools or offices with a specific dress code, everyone gets to wear jeans if they raise enough money to meet a goal.

Eat for a Cause

Ask a local restaurant to sponsor a Blessings Night and donate 10% of their profits on a designated night.

Birthday Pledge
