Things You Should Notify NSS About

- 1. Change of address and phone number.
- 2. Change of name if you get married or divorced.

- 5. The addition of a named POA (Power of Attorney).



SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR MEMBERS

A Fraternal Program

PURPOSE ~

To encourage our older members to continue their education and to make fuller use of their leisure time.

MEMBER ELIGIBILITY ~

Any life insurance or annuity member, fifty-five (55) years or older, who has enrolled and successfully completed a continuing education or adult education course. Members may submit up to two (2) applications in one calendar year.

COURSE ELIGIBILITY ~

Vocational schools, community colleges and universities offer a variety of short-term courses which may include areas like computer training, cake decorating, photography, landscaping, small engine repair, ballroom dancing, etc. This program does not cover courses that assist you to maintain your current full or part-time job. (Example: We will not reimburse life insurance or real estate agents who take continuing education credits to maintain their licenses.)

PROCEDURE ~

Members should enroll and pay for the course of their choice. Once the member has finished the class, they must submit an application, along with verification that the class was successfully completed, to the Home Office for approval by a National Officer. If the scholarship application is approved, the NSS will reimburse one-half (1/2) of the tuition for the course up to, but not to exceed, one hundred dollars.

Interesting Things To Know Abut IRAs

Since the deadline for IRAs is right around the corner (Tuesday, April 18, 2017) here are a few interesting facts that you may or may not know:

- The IRA program began in 1974 and that year the most you could contribute was \$1,500. Today the maximum is \$5,500 and an additional \$1,000 catch-up amount if you are age 50 or older.
- A child can have a Roth IRA if they have taxable earned income.
- A nonworking spouse can open and contribute to an IRA provided the other spouse is working and they file a joint return.
- If you exceed certain income limits you may not be able to contribute to a traditional IRA but you can always make non-deductible contributions and then later convert those to a Roth IRA.
- Self-employed people should explore a SEP IRA because it has much higher contribution limits.
- If your income is too much for a traditional IRA then look at the Roth IRA because it has higher income limits.
- If you are receiving alimony payments this amount can count as earned income.
- Since 2013, more money has gone into Roth IRAs than traditional IRAs
- If you have a traditional IRA, you may convert it to a Roth IRA. And if later, you decide that wasn't working out to your advantage you can undo the conversion.
- \bullet A Roth IRA has no minimum distributions (RMDs) unlike a traditional IRA does at age $70\frac{1}{2}$.

As the 2016 tax year winds to a close – let's resolve to make 2017 a better year. Decide now to open, fund, or contribute more money to your IRA accounts this year.

What is Slovak Food? I have never heard of it!

The traditional food of Slovakia is not exactly well known around the world. This is a huge shame! Slovak may not be the most low-fat cuisine out there (but then, a little fat is good for you), but it is very wholesome, down-to-earth cooking. It's like spending everyday at your grandparents. Slovak food is very cheap, easy to cook, and best of all, extremely delicious!

Slovak Cuisine

The cuisine has its origin in the diverse Slovak geography. The landscapes vary from flat lowlands of the Danube valley in the south, through the wine producing Tokaj region in the east, to the snow-capped alpine peaks of the Tatra mountains in the north. Traditionally, Slovakia was a

land of simple peasants, who spent their days working in the fields or watching after sheep in the mountains. The cuisine evolved from the ingredients people grew in their gardens, or from the products of the animals they raised. Potatoes, tomatoes, peppers and onions make the basis of many dishes. These are supplemented by chicken, pork, and to a lesser degree beef. And then there are the sheep. Besides mutton (which isn't actually all that common), sheep produced various cheese products, including a fetalike cheese called Bryndza and the smoked cheese Oštiepok.

This will also give you an idea of the kinds of dishes you may expect to find in a typical Slovak restaurant.



How To Make A Sailboat

Craft foam Mini bamboo skewers

Pencil Scissors Washi tape
Wine bottle corks Rubber bands

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Draw the shape of a sail onto your foam sheet in pencil. You can use one of the skewers as a guide to make sure your sail isn't too big or too small.
- 2. Cut out the sail with scissors.
- 3. Poke the skewer through the top and bottom of the sail, so that the pointy end comes out of the bottom.
- 4. Wrap a strip of washi tape around the top of the skewer, then trim into a triangle to create your sailboat's flag.
- 5. Create the base of the boat by laying three corks next to each other and securing with two rubber bands.
- 6. Poke the pointy end of the skewer into the middle cork to attach your mast.



Joseph Stefka, Jr. Chairman of the Board

April, 1870

Albert Mamatey, the third president of the National Slovak Society was born in the village of Klastor pod Znievom in Turiec County.

April, 1930

Juraj (George) Tomascik was elected as the sixth president of the National Slovak Society at the XVI Convention in Lorain, Ohio. He was the first American born NSS President.

April, 1977

The results of a referendum vote to change the location of the 1978 Convention were announced. A total of 1730 votes were recorded, 71 votes to keep the location in Los Angeles, California, and 1659 votes to change the location. The change of location would be an agenda item at the upcoming Annual Meeting in May.

April, 1983

Karol Belohlavek, a National Slovak Society member, and one of the founders of the Slovak Garden died.

April, 2002

National Secretary-Treasurer Paul M. Payerchin, Jr. reported that the Society was closing in on a milestone of \$100 million in assets.

Avella Area School District is a small, rural school district located in Washington County, Pennsylvania. The Blessings in a Backpack Program at Avella is conducted by the Avella Chapter of the National Honor Society as part of their service to the local community. The Blessings in a Backpack program relies on individuals from the community to provide and pack food for children who are at risk of not being fed over the weekend. Your donation will enable the National Honor Society to continue a valuable service to children within the Avella community." 

Peter V. Rovnianek Scholarship Fund

The following rules will determine eligibility in applying for a National Slovak Society, Peter Vitazoslav (PVR) Scholarship Grant:

- The applicant must be a member of the National Slovak Society (NSS) for a minimum of two (2) years prior to receiving a PVR Scholarship Grant. Membership will be verified by the Home Office.
- 2. The minimum amount of insurance required for eligibility is \$10,000 of PERMANENT life insurance or \$5,000.00 of annuity deposits. The insurance must be in force at the time of application and be maintained throughout the scholarship period.
- Eligible to apply are all student NSS members whose scholastic records, including College Board
 Examinations qualify them for acceptance by a college, university (4 years); junior college, nursing, trade, technical or business school (2 yrs) or other institution approved by the NSS National Assembly.
- 4. All applications must be accompanied by a transcript of the latest high school scholastic record of the applicant. For those already attending college, only college transcripts need to be submitted.
- 5. All applications must be accompanied by proof of the applicant's acceptance as a full-time student by an accredited college, university, junior college, business or trade school. Please list <u>ONLY</u> the school that you are going to attend, not all of the schools that you have applied and been accepted by.
- 6. All applications must be accompanied by a resume or biographical sketch of the applicant, not to exceed two hundred (200) words, along with a recent photograph for publication in the society's magazine.

- 7. All applicants must submit proof of fraternal activity. This activity may be participation in national or local activities, holding elective office in a fraternal
 - benefit society, or similar fraternal involvement. In lieu of fraternal activity, an applicant may substitute community service or volunteer activity with a non-profit organization. (e.g. Hospitals, Red Cross, Juvenile Diabetes or similar charitable organizations.) Applicants must submit verification signed by an assembly
 - officer or by an adult in charge of the community service or volunteer activity.
- 8. No application will be considered unless all requirements are met and fulfilled. Transcripts and all other forms included with the application shall be the property of the PVR Scholarship Fund and the National Slovak Society and will not be returned to the applicant.
- 9. In the event that a PVR Scholarship is granted, it shall be the responsibility of the student to remain in school full-time and to maintain a 3.0 GPA or higher for the remainder installments of the grant to be received.
- 10. The deadline for submitting applications for scholarship grants is MAY 1st of each year. Applications can be obtained from the Home Office or your local assembly. oheň - veľkonočná bohoslužba sa začína zapálením veľkonočného ohňa, ktorý symbolizuje víťazstvo Ježiša Krista nad temnotou a smrťou. Od tohto ohňa sa potom zapaľujú veľkonočné sviečky.



vajíčko - je symbolom zatvoreného hrobu,
 z ktorého vstal Kristus, ako symbol
