2018 37th Quadrennial Convention of NSS

From the pounding of the gavel to open the convention to the election of the Board of Directors for the next four years, everything was perfect. I extend my gratitude to each and every delegate in attendance at this convention for their dedication to the NSS and their kindness extended to me, Pam and all of our helpers. I would be remiss if I didn't mention those Hershey employees who helped make our event a huge success: Jason, Lauren, Michelle, Chuck and Patrick to name a few. You would be amazed at what goes on behind the scenes in order to accommodate over 200 members in attendance. Thank you for your efforts.

At this convention we introduced a new way of voting when a vote was called for. Using electronic handheld remotes each delegate in attendance was able to vote within seconds and immediately see the results. What a time savings. I heard so many favorable comments about the new process from our Delegates.

As a result of the vote to elect nine Directors for the next four (4) years, the delegates voted for all the current Directors to remain in office. The Board will now refocus and continue with the creation and adoption of required Board Policies (primarily in the areas of Cybersecurity, Disaster Recovery and Business Continuity). Also, we anticipate communication from the PA Insurance Department that they will soon begin their Risk Based State Audit (we will receive a questionnaire from the state requesting preliminary information within the next several months). This audit could take 4-6 months to complete.

And finally some interesting convention facts. There were:

- 208 Registered delegates
- 264 Officers, Members, and Guests were present at the Tuesday evening banquet
- *29 Youth attended the FUNFEST event*
- 4 Delegates were over the age of 90

The History of the Pittsburgh Cookie Table

My nephew is getting married in November of this year which made me start thinking about CAKE AND COOK-IES, which always brings back fond memories. For many generations, the cookie table has been a staple at weddings in Pittsburgh, as well as throughout Southwestern Pennsylvania. I can still remember attending weddings with my family and seeing the "baba's" in attendance pulling out their paper or



plastic bags or using their handkerchiefs from their purses in order to take home as many

cookies as they could.

Too many people who are not natives to Pittsburgh, the idea of having a cookie table at a wedding may be baffling. However, the cookie table is a strong tradition that has stood the test of time in Pittsburgh.

It is believed that this tradition started during the Great Depression when many families could not afford a wedding cake, instead substituting homemade cookies baked by the wife's family as part of their financial responsibility to pay for the wedding.

Traditionally, the bride's immediate family, including her mother, grandmothers, aunts, cousins and closest friends, spend the months before the wedding dutifully baking cookies from scratch.

Every cookie is made with love in the hope that the married couple will share in many happy years with one another as there were dozens of cookies at the wedding.

This tradition has long been practiced by various cultures that have migrated to Pittsburgh over the decades including the Italian, German, Irish, Slovak and other Eastern European cultures.

Slow and Steady Wins the Race

Everyone knows Aesop's Fable of the tortoise and the hare. They are going to race each other and, of course, the hare should win by a landslide. The hare has such a big lead at the beginning of the race that he decides to take a nap and wait for the tortoise to catch up. However, when he awakens the tortoise has passed him and crosses the finish line in first place.

The lesson here is that perseverance pays off. Slow and steady wins in the long run. So how does this relate to today? Let's use the example of getting rich quickly. Is this even possible? It sure is - some people inherit money, some win the lottery and some earn unbelievable amounts because of their profession. 
The last VIP Birthday is.... Andy Warhol.

Born Andrew Warhola, Andy was born on August 6, 1928. His parents, Julia and Andrej Warhola were Carpatho-Rusyns who immigrated from what is now known as eastern Slovakia. He grew up during the Great Depression in the urban surroundings of the smoky industrial city know as Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

At an early age, he showed a wonderful talent for drawing. Andy attended Schenley High School and graduated at the young age of 16 in 1945. He was the first member of his family to ever go beyond high school by attending Carnegie Institute of Technology (currently known as Carnegie Mellon University). He then moved to New York City to pursue the world of art.

Andy Warhol was an artist, filmmaker, photographer, author, editor, and cultural icon and had an illustrious career as one of the most famous artists of our time. (Think Campbell's Soup and Marilyn Monroe). In 1987 Warhol was hospitalized to have an infected gall bladder removed. Though the routine operation was successful, he died mysteriously during the early morning of February 22, 1987. He was 58 years old. Andy Warhol was laid to rest alongside his parents, Julia and Andrej Warhola, at St. John the Baptist Byzantine Catholic Cemetery in Bethel Park, Pennsylvania. 





This Month in National Slovak Society History

Joseph Stefka, Jr., Chairman of the Board

August, 1896

A monument to Samo Tomašik, author of the patriotic hymn, "Hej Slovaci," was unveiled during a dedication ceremony held in Connellsville, Pennsylvania, on August 20, 1896. The dedication ceremony was attended by 15,000 visitors

August, 1970

The 25th Quadrennial Convention was held in Chicago, Illinois, from August 2-7, 1970. A newcomer to the National Slovak Society national scene, Paul J. Godor, was elected as Second Vice-President of the Society.

August, 1998

The 32nd Quadrennial Convention, held at Willow Valley Resort in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, opened with a symbolic merger ceremony with representatives of the First Slovak Wreath of the Free Eagle, the Presbyterian Beneficial Union, the Russian Orthodox Catholic Women's Mutual Aid Society, and the National Slovak Society taking part. A square candle with the initials of each Society was placed together on a table and lighted during each convention session. The candles burned individually but melted together representing the merger of the societies.

August, 2002

At the 33rd Quadrennial Convention held in Grand Island, New York, delegate Andrew Chengery of Assembly 108 proposed that the National Slovak Society consider adding a museum to its Home Office and asked members to donate any Slovak memorabilia to the museum to preserve the history of the Society and to promote Slovak culture.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR MEMBERS A Fraternal Program

PURPOSE ~

To encourage our older members to continue their education and to make fuller use of their leisure time.

MEMBER ELIGIBILITY ~

Any life insurance or annuity member, fifty-five (55) years or older, who has enrolled and successfully completed a continuing education or adult education course. Members may submit up to two (2) applications in one calendar year.

COURSE ELIGIBILITY ~

Vocational schools, community colleges and universities offer a variety of shortterm courses which may include areas like computer training, cake decorating, photography, landscaping, small engine repair, ballroom dancing, etc. This program does not cover courses that assist you to maintain your current full or part-time job. (Example: We will not reimburse life insurance or real estate agents who take continuing education credits to maintain their licenses.)

PROCEDURE ~

Members should enroll and pay for the course of their choice. Once the member has finished the class, they must submit an application, along with verification that the class was successfully completed, to the Home Office for approval by a National Officer. If the scholarship application is approved, then NSS will reimburse one-half (1/2) of the tuition for the course up to, but not to exceed, one hundred dollars.
