This year we are celebrating 50 years of golf and will have some special gifts for the attendees, so plan on attending if you can.

Thursday, July 21st is the Annual Slovak Kennywood Day which is always well attended by Slovaks in the Tri-State Pittsburgh Area. I look forward to serving you at the Slovak Food Kitchen. Stop by and say hi!

On the Assembly and Region level, July 2nd and 3rd, Assembly 0705 in Indiana will be holding a reunion, July 17th, Assembly 0039 from Uniontown will be holding a local golf outing, and on July 24th, Region 14 will be hosting a picnic.

Other Fraternal Organizations

In addition to fraternal organizations such as our National Slovak Society, and our sister fraternals that operate the same way as us in selling insurance in order to fund our fraternal side, there also exist many other fraternal type organizations. One that I have personal experience with, having been a member, is Rotary. I was introduced to Rotary by NSS Life member Tod Wilcock who invited me to attend a weekly lunch that McMurray Rotary holds. I was surprised to learn about all the good things Rotary does for the community.

Rotary is a 1.2 million-member organization started with the vision of one man, Paul Harris. This Chicago attorney formed one of the world's first service organizations, the Rotary Club of Chicago, on February 23, 1905, as a place where professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships. Rotary's name came from the groups early practice of rotating meetings among the offices of each member.

Rotarians have not only been present for major events in history but have also been a part of them. From the founding of the organization, three key traits have remained strong throughout the history of Rotary:

1. Truly international. Only 16 years after being founded, Rotary had clubs on six continents. Today, they work together from around the globe both digitally and in-person to solve some of our world's most challenging problems.

- 2. They persevere in tough times. During WWII, Rotary clubs in Germany, Austria, Italy, Spain, and Japan were forced to disband. Despite the risks, many continued to meet informally and following the wars end, Rotary members joined together to rebuild their clubs and their countries.
- 3. Commitment to service is ongoing. Rotary began the fight against polio in 1979 with a project to immunize 6 million children in the Philippines. By 2012, only three countries remained polio-endemic, down from 125 in 1988. Another project that Rotary has going on, for countries in need, is the sand filter project that provides a system to help provide clean water.

Some names you may recognize that have been Rotarians are Warren G. Harding, U.S. President; Marconi, Italian inventor of the wireless radio and Nobel laureate; Admiral Richard E. Byrd, American explorer; Manny Pacquaio, Filipino world champion boxer and congressman; Frank Borman, American astronaut; James Cash Penney, founder of JC Penney Co.; and Jan Masaryk, foreign minister of Czechoslovakia.

Rotarians have a FOUR-WAY TEST of the things we think, say, or do, which if everyone used, the world would be a better place to live;

- 1. Is it the TRUTH?
- 2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
- 3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
- 4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

Cell Phone Insurance

We recently got new phones in our household. After shopping around for the best deal and carrier we made the decision to get everyone a nice, new smartphone. The funny thing about this phone is the retail cost which is about \$800. When you buy it within a plan you seem to get a subsidized price. One of the last questions I was asked while signing up for service was if I would like insurance on the phone? Because if it is dropped or damaged I would have to pay the retail price of \$800 to get it replaced. However, if I purchase the insurance for \$8 per month and something happens to my phone – I would only owe a \$50 copay and it would be replaced. So I asked how many people add the insurance option. The answer may surprise you – almost everyone. I was told that the reason is most people can't afford the \$800 replacement price if something happens.

This last statement floored me and I started to think about it. First, the part about most people can't afford \$800 to replace a phone? Next, if something happens – not when? Being a life insurance guy I made the leap to life insurance. Believe it or not someday we will all die. Not *if* we die, but *when* we die. And if an \$800 bill is problematic – how would your heirs continue without any income at all? Ironically it turns out that most people buy cell phone insurance but not life insurance?

- Jack Johnson, NHL player earned more than \$23 million but had to declare bankruptcy after his agent outspent his earnings. His agent was his parents.

The smart ones with money are -

- Ryan Broyles, NFL free agent has earned more than \$3 million in his short career and has banked almost all of it. He can retire and live off the interest because of his modest lifestyle.
- Shaquille O'Neal, NBA superstar has earned more than \$300 million in salary and an equal amount in endorsements. He is set for life because he used annuities to save money for the future.
- Roger Staubach, NFL quarterback for the Dallas Cowboys didn't earn the big money that athletes get today. In fact he was paid \$25,000 in his rookie season. July, 1991

Playing in the first foursome of the tournament with Jim Violi, Don Kniska, and Alan Burns, Joe Violi of Assembly #4 scores the first hole-in-one in National Slovak Society National Golf Tournament history on July 20, 1991. Joe aced the 16th hole at Speidel Golf Course located in Wheeling, West Virginia during the first round of the tournament. This remains the only hole-in-one scored during NSS National Golf Tournament play!

July, 1991

Assembly 39 of Uniontown, Pennsylvania, celebrated the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Assembly with a gala banquet.

July, 1993

A "Candlelight Golf Banquet" was held during the National Golf Tournament held at Linden Hall Resort in Dawson, Pennsylvania due to a power outage caused by a severe storm that hit the area at the conclusion of Saturday's tournament round.

July, 1994

President David Blazek wins the inaugural Joseph Stefka Memorial Golf Award at the NSS National Golf Tournament held at Avalon Lakes Golf Course in Warren, Ohio.

July, 1998

Honorary Tribunal Member Emily Leo died. Emily had served the Society as a member of the Tribunal from 1987 – 1994.

SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR MEMBERS A Fraternal Program

PURPOSE ~

To encourage our older members to continue their education and to make fuller use of their leisure time.

Any life insurance or annuity member, fifty-five (55) years or older, who has enrolled and successfully completed a continuing education or adult education course. Members may submit up to two (2) applications in one calendar year.
