

### Frequently Asked Questions About The NSS

(Continued from last issue)

#### Q: What products do you offer?

A: The National Slovak Society offers its members two types of life insurance coverage; permanent and term. Permanent plans of insurance build cash and loan values; while term plans offer the most protection for the lowest cost.

The Society also offers to our membership, two types of tax deferred annuities; qualified and non-qualified. Qualified annuities are funded with pre-tax dollars; while non-qualified annuities are funded with after-tax dollars.

#### Q: What is an NSS annuity?

A: Its a contract between you and us that provides you with a guaranteed future income in exchange for payments you make to your account. It's a long term way of planning for the future, particularly for your retirement. Both IRS Qualified and Non-Qualified annuities are available in an NSS Annuity Contract.

#### Q: How do I become a member?

A: All you need to do is purchase either a life insurance policy or an NSS annuity, and apply for membership. As long as you maintain an active policy with the NSS, you will remain a member of the Society.

### **Q:** Do I have to be Slovak to become a member?

A: The answer is no; membership in the Society is open to anyone who purchases either a life insurance policy or an NSS annuity, and believes in the Society Mission Statement.





### **ASSEMBLY 731 - THREE GENERATIONS**

In the early 1900's Jan Andrez Balaz and Maria Justina Kluchar came to the United States from different regions of the area now known as Slovakia. The two eventually met each other in Struthers, Ohio and got married in 1907. Like so many other immigrants at that time, the pronunciation and spelling of their names became Americanized so they became known as John Andrew Bolash and she would be called Mary. Both were active members of NSS. Together John and Mary Bolash raised nine children and over the



past 108 years, the family has grown to include hundreds of descendants. Some of John & Mary's descendants gathered together this summer at a Region 7 picnic. NSS family members traveled to Struthers, Ohio for the event from Arizona and Florida and enjoyed a weekend together. 

### SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR MEMBERS A Fraternal Program

#### PURPOSE ~

To encourage our older members to continue their education and to make fuller use of their leisure time.

#### MEMBER ELIGIBILITY ~

Any life insurance or annuity member, fifty-five (55) years or older, who has enrolled and successfully completed a continuing education or adult education course. Members may submit up to two (2) applications in one calendar year.

#### **COURSE ELIGIBILITY** ~

Vocational schools, community colleges and universities offer a variety of short-term courses which may include areas like computer training, cake decorating, photography, landscaping, small engine repair, ballroom dancing, etc. This program does not cover courses that assist you to maintain your current full or part-time job. (Example: We will not reimburse life insurance or real estate agents who take continuing education credits to maintain their licenses.)

#### PROCEDURE ~

Members should enroll and pay for the course of their choice. Once the member has finished the class, they must submit an application, along with verification that the class was successfully completed, to the Home Office for approval by a National Officer. If the scholarship application is approved, the NSS will reimburse one-half (1/2) of the tuition for the course up to, but not to exceed, one hundred dollars.

#### FAMOUS SLOVAKS IN AMERICA

(Translated by request from the July 2015 Noviny)



Audrey Hepburn (1929–1993) One of the most recognizable faces in films in the second half of the 20th Century. Her Original name was Edda van Heemstra Hepburn-Ruston. Her roots in Slovakia are from the village Kovarce, near Topolčany, where her grandfather Joseph Ruston operated a sugar factory. Later, the family moved to Vienna where her father, a banker married Baroness Ella van Heemstra. Actress Audrey Hepburn starred in more than 30 film projects.



**Tom Selleck** (1945)American film actor and film producer. His father Robert Selleck was born in Eastern Slovakia, while his mother had Scottish roots. According to one source, he was baptized in the Orthodox Church. He gained his greatest popularity from the criminal detective series Magnum.

#### SLOVAK HOLLYWOOD



Steve McQueen (1930 –1980) American Film Actor. His original name was Stefan Ihnat. Both parents came from Slovakia and settled in Indiana. I am the weed whacker, a whacker of weeds I will take care of your weed whacking needs I whack and I whack for as long as I please


It sounds cheerful, right But it is my plight Eons ago I had lost my choice Now I no longer have reason to rejoice
