

### Little Known Facts

The Americanization of names as well as intermarriage among ethnic-groups precludes identifying persons of Slovak ancestry who have made significant contributions to American society or to the arts, sciences, education, industry, and government. Below are a few.

**Aerospace** - Astronaut Eugene Cernan participated in Gemini spaceflights and Apollo-Saturn moon missions; his father came to the US from Kysuce in Slovakia.

Art and Entertainment - Andy Warhol (1928-1987), pop artist, famous for his paintings of soup cans and other modern art, was the son of immigrants who came to the US from Slovakia in 1913.

Literature - Thomas Bell (1903-1961), originally Belejcak, was a second-generation Slovak author of six novels; his best and most famous novel, *Out of This Furnace*, vividly portrays the life of Slovak immigrants, their children, and grandchildren from the turn of the century into the Great Depression of the 1930's.

Military - Michael Strank (d. 1945), a Slovak who came to the US in 1922. was one of the six men immortalized by the famous photograph of the raising of the American flag a top Mount Suribachi, Iwo Jima, on February 23, 1945; the US Marine Corps Memorial Monument located adjacent to Arlington National Cemetery is based on that photograph. The exact number of Slovaks who served in WWI cannot be determined. Military records for the period after 1920 categorize Slovaks and Czechs together as Czechoslovaks. According to the 1990 census, 6,566 persons, including 635 women, of Slovak ancestry were serving in the US Military. I hope these facts were as fun to read as they were to research.

# Museum Minutes... 8.15

The wood carving craft, which involves decorating wooden objects by carving, engraving, sawing, sharpening, beating, burning and other techniques as well as making various objects of art from wood, became one of the most exquisite crafts in Slovakia. The beautiful and various products of wood-carving can be

seen at folk and historical markets and are counted among popular Slovak souvenirs.

In September 2002, Anne and Dave Dayton of Slovak Folk Crafts commissioned three skillful woodcarvers in Slovakia to design and build a unique, animated woodcarving display. Completed in May 2005, it took 2½ years -- six months for each of five sections -- to complete this display. After thorough testing, each section was crated, placed in a container in Prešov, Slovakia, and then traveled by land and sea to western Pennsylvania. Carved from basswood, this unique work-of-art is 17 ft. long x 8 ft. tall x 6 ft. deep and has 82 life-like moving figures. The scenes depict folk life as it has existed in Slovakia for hundreds of years with a large manger scene as the focal point. This display is believed to be the largest animated woodcarving in the United States and perhaps in all of North America.



Unfortunately, the Slovak Folk Crafts store in Grove City closed permanently after the holidays in December 2014. Many people were concerned about what would happen to this magnificent wood carving.

We are very pleased to announce that the wood carving has been moved to our NSS Heritage Museum. It is being re-assembled and will become a permanent display in the museum.

# Každý piaty Slovák je závislý od počítača a internetu, vyšlo v prieskume

BRATISLAVA. Významná časť populácie na Slovensku sa bez počítačov, internetu či <u>mobilu</u> nedokáže zaobísť. Ako ukázal celoslovenský prieskum Inštitútu pre verejné otázky (IVO), každý piaty Slovák je závislý od počítača a internetu.

Výsledky prieskumu agentúre SITA poskytol projektový koordinátor inštitútu Ján Bartoš. Bez mobilu či <u>smartfónu</u> by nedokázalo vydržať ani jeden deň 36 percent opýtaných, bez <u>notebookov</u>, <u>tabletov</u> či internetu 21 percent.

IVO prieskum spravil na vzorke 1,083 respondentov starších ako 18 rokov, je súčasťou dlhodobého projektu Digitálna gramotnosť na Slovensku.

Závislosť od moderných informačných a komunikačných technológií najviac ohrozuje mladých ľudí vo veku od 14 do 34 rokov - študentov, vysokoškolsky vzdelaných podnikateľov a ľudí, ktorí sa živia duševnou, nie manuálnou prácou.
