AQS Managing Director Larry White presented the Investment Report tor Pam Blum reported on events for . 2020 Year End Results were presented by H2R CPA Donald Reddinger and Legal Counsel P Ronald Cooper, Esq. presented an overview of legal items.

Fraternal Activities for 2021 were presented by the Fraternal Activities Coordinator. Interest Rates were discussed and set for the 2nd Quarter of 2021. FHL Bank and Ascensus Resolution were presented for Board approval and Signature. The Status of our KBRA efforts were reviewed along with the result of our CA Market Conduct Exam.

A 2022 38th Quadrennial Convention update was presented, and all Petitions acted upon. The CIO Report

was presented and the NSS Strategic Plan reviewed. We will move forward with plans for the Assembly Officers Seminar. This concludes the major items addressed at the March 2021 Board Meeting.

AQS Managing Director Larry White presented the Investment Report followed by the Overview of the 2021 1st Quarter presented by H2R CPA Donald Reddinger via Teams. The Actuary Report was presented by Ed Cowman, Miller/ Newberg. The review of the Strategic Plan was presented for discussion.

Interest rates were set for the 3rd Quarter 2021. The corporate Governance Annual Disclosure filing was completed. The Paycheck Protection Program Loan Resolution and the Merrill Lynch Advisory Services Resolution were adopted.

It was decided to review the Strategic Plan after the 2022 Convention. Reports of the Museum Committee and the Risk Management and Governance Committees followed. This concluded the business of the May 2021 Meeting.

It was December 23, 1993. For a single mom who was going to college and supporting my children completely alone, Christmas was looking bleak. I looked around my little home, realization dawning like a slow, twisting pain. We were poor.

Our tiny house had two bedrooms, both off the living room. They were so small that my baby daughter's crib barely fit into one room, and my son's twin bed and dresser were squeezed into the other. There was no way they could share a room, so I made my bed every night on the living room floor.

The three of us shared the only closet in the house. We were snug, always only a few feet from each other, day and night. With no doors on the children's rooms, I could see and hear them at all times. It made them feel secure, and it made me feel close to them -- a blessing I wouldn't have had in other circumstances.

It was early evening, about eight o'clock. The snow was falling softly, silently, and my children were both asleep. I was wrapped in a blanket, sitting at the window, watching the powdery flakes flutter in the dimming light, when my front door vibrated with a pounding fist.

Alarmed, I wondered who would stop by unannounced on such a snowy winter night. I opened the door to find a group of strangers grinning from ear to ear, their arms laden with boxes and bags.

Confused, but finding their joyous spirit contagious, I grinned right back at them. "Are you Susan?" The man stepped forward as he held out a box for me. Nodding stupidly, unable to find my voice, I was sure they thought I was mentally deficient.

me with a huge, beaming smile. The porch light and the snow falling behind her cast a glow over her dark hair, lending her an angelic appearance.

I looked down into her box. It was filled to the top with delicious treats, a fat turkey, and all the makings of a traditional Christmas dinner. My eyes filled with tears as the realization of why they were there washed over me.

Finally coming to my senses, I found my voice and invited them in. Following the husband were two children, staggering with the weight of their packages. The family introduced themselves and told me their packages were all gifts for my little family. This wonderful, beautiful family, who were total strangers to me, somehow knew exactly what we needed. They brought wrapped gifts for each of us, a full buffet for me to make on Christmas Day, and many "extras" that I could never afford. Visions of a beautiful, "normal" Christmas literally danced in my head. Somehow my secret wish for Christmas was materializing right in front of me. The desperate prayers of a single mom had been heard, and I knew right then that God had sent his angels my way.

My mysterious angels then handed me a white envelope, gave me another round of grins, and took turns hugging me. They wished me a Merry Christmas and disappeared into the night as suddenly as they had appeared.

Amazed and deeply touched, I looked around me at the boxes and gifts strewn at my feet and felt the ache of depression suddenly being transformed into a childlike joy. I began to cry. I cried hard, sobbing tears of the deepest gratitude. A great sense of peace filled me. The knowledge of God's love reaching into my tiny corner of the world enveloped me like a warm quilt. My heart was full. I fell to my knees amid all the boxes and offered a heartfelt prayer of thanks.

Getting to my feet, I wrapped myself in my blankets and sat once again to gaze out the window at the gently falling snow. Suddenly, I remembered the envelope. Like a child, I ripped it open and gasped at what I saw. A shower of bills flitted to the floor. Gathering them up, I began to count the five, ten, and twenty-dollar bills. As my vision blurred with tears, I counted the money, then recounted it to make sure I had it right. Sobbing again, I said it out loud: "One hundred dollars."

I looked at my children sleeping soundly, and through my tears I smiled my first happy, free-of-worry smile in a long, long time. My smile turned into a grin as I thought about tomorrow: Christmas Eve. One visit from complete strangers had magically turned a painful day into a special one that we would always remember...with happiness.

It is now several years since our Christmas angels visited. I have remarried, and our household is happy and richly blessed. Every year since that Christmas in 1993, we have chosen a family less blessed than we are. We bring them carefully selected gifts, food and treats, and as much money as we can spare. It's our way of passing on what was given to us. It's the "ripple effect" in motion. We hope that the cycle continues and that, someday, the families we share with will be able to pass it on, too.

May your days be merry, bright, and full of love. Next time you're feeling stressed about the holidays, we hope you remember this story, count your blessings, and try to pay it forward by giving to those that need it most. Merry Christmas to all!

## The Mona Lisa and Life Insurance

What could these two things possibly have in common? Well believe it or not - a lot. When Leonardo DaVinci painted the Mona Lisa do you think he had a masterpiece. What do think they offered him for the painting? Do you think someone offered him a thousand lira or more? To our knowledge he was offered nothing because it was just painted. Over time this artifact became a valuable painting and a real treasured museum piece. In part because of the painter. Partly because it is a one-ofa-kind masterpiece that was valued at \$100 million in 1962 so with inflation and in today's dollars it is estimated to be worth more than \$800 million.

What about life insurance? When you buy a policy is it valuable? You better believe it - each policy is its own masterpiece and unlike art it is immediately valuable. A \$100,000 whole life plan would pay that face amount upon the demise of the insured. And if the person lives a long time the face amount and the cash value would continue to increase and be worth more than the original face amount because of dividends.

In many respects the life insurance plan is valuable today and more so tomorrow. Insurance rates have never been less than they are right now and they will be increasing in the near future. ## RMD's and What You Need to Know

Anyone with a qualified plan (IRA, 401k, SEP, etc.) needs to know about required minimum distributions or RMDs. These retirement accounts accumulate money on a tax-deferred basis. At withdrawal presumably taxes will be due. To make sure the government gets their tax money they have a rule that says anyone turning age 72 must take so much out of the account.

The amount that must be withdrawn is the end of the preceding year account balance divided by a factor from the IRS uniform lifetime table based on your age. For example: a person age 75 factor is 22.9), with a \$100,000 IRA balance would have an RMD of \$4,367. This is the minimum that must be withdrawn to be compliant. If you have multiple IRAs they may be lumped together and one amount may come out from one account or you may withdraw from each one separately their proportional share. Sometimes people take their RMD from the account earning the least.

A 401k or a 403b would have their own separate RMD and withdrawal rules. Some of these plans may also allow a waiver if you are still working. NSS always recommends that a person consult their tax advisor for specific information on how their actions may impact their situation.


Failing to take the RMD has one of the most onerous IRS penalties. A 50% excise tax on the amount not distributed. NSS always tries to send out an RMD letter to our members in late January. Sometimes people transfer their accounts to us after that so we may not be aware of their RMD status. It is important to remember that this responsibility is the taxpayer's.

Some items to consider as you reach this phase of life:

- Consolidating IRAs so that you don't lose track of any accounts.
- Consider rolling over an IRA to a Roth IRA for the long term benefit of taxfree proceeds. Initially, taxes would be due on any conversion.
- Other moves that your tax professional or advisor may recommend.





1. Plastic candy canes! It doesn't matter what color they are because you'll be covering them up! 2. Twine. fairly narrow twine 3. Hot glue & glue gun 4. Scissors 5. Ribbons and additional decorations (berries, springs, tiny pinecones, etc) - totally optional. You can cut apart small pine and berry spray and used the pieces.

### **Directions:**

1. Heat your glue gun! 2. Lay about an inch of twine down the candy cane. as shown. 3. Add hot glue around

the bottom of the candy cane, then begin wrapping it with twine. Make sure to work quickly, before the glue has a chance to set





4. Continue wrapping up the candy cane, making sure your wraps are snug and close together. Every few inches, you can add a dab of glue to help hold everything in place.

5. When you get just a few wraps from the end, go ahead and cut your twine.

Cut it so you'll have about an extra inch or so more than you'll need to finish wrapping. If you're not



sure how much this will be, go ahead and finish wrapping the candy cane without adding hot glue and then cut the twine. Unwrap the last few wraps, then add hot glue and rewrap. Add a dab of glue to the very end of the candy cane then curl the extra twine in place to conceal it.

6. Your twine candy cane ornaments are basically finished now! Glue each

piece of greenery and berry in place. Then conceal the glue with a piece of 1/4 inch ribbon.

Želáme všetkým naším členom a čitateľom radostné a Požehnané Vianočne sviatky.




