

The time between the end of the vear and March 1st is the busiest time of the year for the NSS Home Office. In addition to conducting the normal everyday business of the Society, the Home Office Staff is involved in several major initiatives in the first two months of the year. One is the processing of all the 1099 forms for our members who have taken withdrawals from their annuities. A second is the preparation of the annual statements for our members holding an annuity. The third is the preparation of all year-end financial activities and preparing the Annual Financial Statement by March 1st. A fourth is the preparation of a vast amount of documentation that is submitted to our rating agency KBRA for the annual rating surveillance process. Additionally, this year, our Home Office Employees are involved in a very crucial period in the conversion of our policy administration system. A great deal of time has been spent preparing material to customize the new software system, testing the system to ensure that it meets our needs and functions properly, and participating in training to utilize the new system. The new policy administration system will be phased in over the next eight months. Our Home Office Staff has done an outstanding job keeping up with the day-to-day operations and managing to fulfill all the additional responsibilities over the course of the last several months. Thank you. Home Office Staff. for your dedication to the Society, to our 38,000 plus members, and 1400 agents across the country! We greatly appreciate all that you do and our Blessed to have such an exceptional staff!

The month of March brings us St. Patrick's Day on March 17th, the beginning of Spring on March 20th, and Daylight Savings Time begins at 2:00 a.m. on Sunday, March 12th. Remember to turn your clocks ahead one hour before you go to bed on Saturday night, or you will be late for church on Sunday morning!

The Board of Directors will meet virtually for the Winter Board Meeting on Saturday, March 18, 2023. If you have any items you would like the Board to consider at the Winter Meeting, please submit them to our Secretary/Treasurer Linda M. Strom at the Home Office by March 8th.

The IRS tax filing deadline for taxes due for the tax year 2022 is April 18th. NSS IRA Annuity holders have time to make a deposit into their IRA for tax year 2022. When depositing money into your IRA Annuity please be sure to indicate the tax year for which you are making the deposit in the memo line of the check.

A reminder that nominations for NSS Fraternalist of the Year and Youth Achievement Award are due by April 1st. Each assembly is encouraged to submit the name of an assembly member that goes the extra mile in volunteering and participating in fraternal activities for the NSS Fraternalist of the Year Award. Also, assemblies can show appreciation for the hard work and community involvement of one of your youth members by submitting a nomination form for the NSS Youth Achievement Award. Every assembly has individuals with the qualities necessary to be recognized for both awards, please take the time to submit an entry.

IRA Deadline Approaching

If you have not made a contribution to an individual Retirement Account in 2022, there are good reasons to considering doing so. An IRA has the benefit that its earnings and gains are not taxed until distribution, or in some cases, they are not taxed at all if the funds are distributed according to the rules. There are limits to how much you can contribute each year but you can still make a contribution to a 2022 IRA by April 15 without affecting the amount you can contribute in 2023. Tax Time – What To Know Now

The maximum contribution for an IRA or a Roth IRA, if you were under age 50 in 2022 is \$6,000. Age 50 or older the max is \$7,000. A person must have earned income to support this contribution.

This year's (2022) deadline to make a contribution is Tuesday, April 18th. If making a contribution up until 4/18, please let us know if it is for tax year 2022 or 2023.

A person can have both an traditional IRA and a Roth IRA in the same year. The total contributions between the two cannot be more than the \$6000 or \$7,000.

A contribution may be made for a non-working spouse.

If you turned age 72 last year then you need to make an RMD (required minimum distribution) from your traditional IRA.

There is no maximum age for the IRA program. So if you are still working at age 75, you can make a contribution to an IRA or a Roth IRA. This is true even though you will have to take an RMD from the traditional IRA account.

If doing a Roth conversion, there will be taxes on the traditional IRA. How much? Depends on your tax bracket. See you accounting professional for guidance in this area.

A Roth IRA can be tax-free if the rules are followed.

A person can open an account with NSS with just a \$100 per month. Once opened the account is flexible.

Want to Earn 4.25% Interest?

This is a great interest rate. It is available on our Preferred 8 and on the Optimum 3. Both are great products but here is a quick overview of the Optimum 3. This plan features a current three-year guarantee of 4.25% interest. Plans issued right now also have a 3.0% minimum guarantee rate that has not been this high for years. Later this year we do expect to roll out our new series of annuity contracts and that guarantee rate will go back to 2.0% interest.

After the initial three years a person would receive a thirty (30) day window letter. During this time frame they could elect to take their money with no penalty, roll over the funds to another contract/company or leave the money with us. If the latter is chosen then the plan would be in year 4 of a Preferred 5 contract. The member would receive the Preferred 5 rate (at whatever it is paying at that time) and they would also be subject to two years of early withdrawal penalties.

There is a 10% penalty free withdrawal amount that may be taken each year. This plan works with any savings, money markets, bank CD money, traditional IRAs and Roth IRAs.


St. Patrick

- 1. The Tournament shall be conducted in compliance with the rules and regulations of the USBC.
- 2. All members of the NSS Life are eligible to participate in this tournament.
- 3. All contestants must be members of the NSS Life as of April 15, 2023 or must have six months premium paid in advance at the time of entry. New bowlers must have bowled a minimum of 21 games as of March 15, 2023. Bowlers with no average see #7 below.
- 4. NSS Life adult members are required to maintain a minimum balance of \$300.00 in an annuity or have a permanent life insurance certificate, to qualify to participate in a NSS Life subsidized sporting event held on a national level i.e. National Bowling Tournament, National Golf Tourna-
- 5. The total cost per person for each event shall be:

a. Prize Fee	\$10.00
b. Bowling Fee	\$8.25
	\$4.75
	\$23.00
Banquet Fee (Optional)	\$0
*All Events (Optional)	\$5.00
*Only bowlers paying the \$5.00	for the All-Events will be eligible for

the cash awards. PRIZE FEE WILL BE RETURNED 100 PERCENT IN EACH EVENT

At least 1 of 10 of participants in each event will win prizes. Note: Contestant may win only one cash prize event (gross or net), whichever cash prize is higher. Excluding special prizes. Awards will be presented to the Contestants who roll the highest gross and highest actu-

- al net scores in each event.
- 6. SUBSTITUTES. Bowlers may compete only once in each event. However, the tournament manager may allow a bowler who has previously bowled to substitute on a four bowler team when one of its original entrants is absent. The score of such bowler in the team event rolled with his entering team must count for all events. No one may bowl in this tournament except those originally entered before the tournament opens or such substitutes who may be authorized by the captain of a team or his appointee provided the individual whose name appears on the entry blank is unable for sufficient reason to attend the tournament at the time scheduled. The Bowling Committee shall have power as to the substitutes that are offered by the captain or his legalized representative, and if accepted, each substitute must bowl each event under his full name and only at scheduled time in each event. The substitutes score and handicap from the said event will be used.
- 7. Any contestant whose current average as of March 15, 2023 of at least 21 games is ten pins or more above his highest average from the previous season must use his current average.

HANDICAP - Handicap (Men) allowed will be 85% of the difference between 240 and last season's 2021-2022 highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games. Bowlers who have no established average will use their highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games as of March 15, 2023. Male bowlers who have no established average for this year or last year will be listed as 175 average and will be handicapped accordingly. If the bowler does not have a sanctioned average over the last two years, but has competed in the Joint Fraternal Tournament, the most recent 5 year history from the Joint Fraternal Tournaments will be used. Male bowlers with an average over 240 will receive no handicap and will bowl scratch in the tournament. Handicap (Women) allowed will be 85% of the difference between 200 and last season's 2021-2022 who have no established average will use their highest sanctioned league average of at least 21 games as of March 15, 2023 Female bowlers who have no established average for this year or last year will be listed as 150 average and will be handicapped accordingly. If the bowler does not have a sanctioned average over the last two years, but has competed in the Joint Fraternal Tournament, the most recent 5 year history from the Joint

Fraternal tournaments will be used. Female bowlers with an average over 200 will receive no handicap and will bowl scratch in the tournament.

Under no circumstances will handicaps be increased after participant has bowled.

Contestants in this tournament are not required to report any tournament prize winnings for the previous 12-month period.

- FALSIFYING AVERAGES PENALTY The team captain is responsible for reporting all averages of the individual team members, and they are responsible to him. Should the Tournament Committee find at any time that the averages have been falsified, the team shall forfeit all claims for prize money as well as their entry fee and will be subject to disqualification and suspension from organized bowling. All prize winners are subject upon request to submit an affidavit of correct league averages.
- 9. Rerating of Bowlers According to USBC Rule No. 319 A-E, bowlers may be rerated by the Tournament Committee.
- 10. All entry applications and bowling fees are to be sent directly to: NSS Life Bowling Tournament, 351 Valley Brook Road, McMurray, PA 15317 not later than April 17, 2023. Rule 310-A2 is in effect.
- 11. Bowlers who participate in tournament games must be dressed in a presentable manner to appear before public and when possible to use an emblem attached to shirt or dress so that participant can be identified.
- 12. Both USBC and eligible non-USBC members may participate in moral support tournaments with high score protection automatically extended to USBC members. Eligible non-USBC members can qualify for high score protection at their option by paying a \$21.00 fee for which the Congress will issue an unattached membership card.
- 13. NO MONEY WILL BE REFUNDED. All prize fee money will be paid in prizes.
- 14. Bowlers may choose to bowl in their respective gender team and doubles event or on a mixed team or mixed doubles team but cannot participate in both divisions. Singles and All Events are gender specific. Mixed team and mixed doubles scores will be used to calculate All Events specific to the gender of the bowler. Must have 6 teams and 10 doubles teams to hold the mixed events.
- 15. In the Doubles contest the names of both members of the team must be given, because entries with the word "Partner" will not be accepted. Entry blanks so compiled will be returned and the entry money retained until proper blank is received. If both entrants in the Doubles event appear when scheduled, it is understood that they must bowl as they have been entered on the original entry blank and no change in position will be allowed at any time after entry blank has been filed.
- 16. Assignment of Alleys The Tournament Committee will make up the alley assignments for all entrants in the Doubles, Singles and Team Events. Entrants in the Doubles and Singles Events are required to report fully 30 minutes prior to the time they are scheduled to bowl. Captains of teams must report their line-up at least 30 minutes before scheduled to bowl.
- 17. In the Doubles & Singles Events bowling entrants will bowl all six of their games on the same pair of lanes. Bowlers entered in the Singles Event only will be assigned to alleys by the Committee.
- 18. A team may use a name other than its league name for tournament entry without the payment of additional membersl1ip dues as formerly required.
- 19. Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify score if submitted average is lower than correct average thereby resulting in a lower classification or more handicap. Prize winnings shall be based on the submitted average if it is higher than the correct average. However, corrections in averages may be permitted up to the completion of the first game of a series.


March 15 is the Ides of March! Legend surrounds this ill-fated day. Beware the Ides of March!



The PVR Scholarship was named after NSS founder, Peter Vitazoslav Rovnianek. Founded in 1966, the scholarship has been a way for the National Slovak Society to show continued support for education. The success of this program is evident by the hundreds of scholarships that have been awarded to our youth members over the years. To qualify, the following criteria need to be met:

- 1. Must be a member of NSS Life for at least two years.
- 2. Must have a minimum of \$10,000 in an active whole life insurance policy, or \$5,000 in an active annuity policy.
- Must be attending a college/university, junior college, trade, technical, nursing, or business school; or other institutions that are approved by the NSS Board of Directors.
- 4. If a scholarship is awarded, the student must maintain a 3.0 cumulative G.P.A. or higher, and be enrolled full-time, to continue receiving the scholarship each consecutive year.

A maximum of \$2,400 can be awarded over 4 years (\$600/year) for those that are eligible. The deadline for 1st year recipients is **May 1st, 2023**. Please contact Pam (**pblum@nsslife.org**) at the home office to request an application.
