Some Fun Facts About the 4th of July

- The Star-Spangled Banner while written by Francis Scott Key in 1814, did not become the national anthem until 1931.
- The Continental Congress voted for our independence on July 2, 1776.
- The Declaration of Independence for formally adopted on July 4, 1776.
- John Adams wanted the holiday to be celebrated on July 2nd and refused to participate in any July 4th parties/ speeches.
- President Zachary Taylor died on July 4, 1850, after eating spoiled fruit following some 4th of July speeches.
- On July 4th of every year, the Liberty Bell in Philadelphia is tapped 13 times in honor of the first thirteen colonies.
- Two of the most famous signers of the Declaration of Independence, John

- Adams, and Thomas Jefferson, both died on July 4, 1826, the 50th anniversary of the signing.
- Calvin Coolidge is the only president so far that was born on July 4th.
- Edward Rutledge was the youngest signer of the Declaration of Independence at age 26. There were 56 original signers to the declaration and Benjamin Franklin was the oldest at age 70.
- John Hancock was the first and most prominent signer. Hence, the phrase, "I need your John Hancock on that line."
- At the time, there were 2.5 million people in the U.S. Today there are 330 million Americans making us the third most populace country behind China and India.
- There have been 27 versions of the U.S. flag. The original one had 13 stars and 13 stripes representing the 13 colonies. The last revision of the flag was in 1960 when the 50th star was added for the state of Hawaii.
- One World Trade Center is 1,776 feet tall (not an accident, by design)
- On July 4th Americans consume about 150 million hot dogs.
- There are more than 15,000 fireworks displays across this great land. Average cost is between \$8,000 to \$15,000. The most expensive fireworks displays are in Boston and Washington, DC, and they both run about \$2 million dollars.

- Scrap of red felt


Tools:

Instructions:



Supplies:


- Embroidery Hoops in Varying Sizes

- Scissors




Instructions:

- 1. Cut your cellophane sheets into triangles (or any shape you desire). Set aside.
- 2. Remove the inner hoop of your embroidery hoop.
- 3. Roll out a sheet of contact paper that is as wide as the hoop, plus about an inch. Remove the backing from the contact paper and place sticky side up on a flat surface.
- 4. Place the inner hoop of your embroidery hoop on top of the contact paper.
- 5. Place the cellophane triangles on the contact paper inside the embroidery hoop (they should stick well to the contact paper).
- 6. Lift the hoop and the contact paper and carefully place inside the outer hoop of the embroidery hoop and tighten at the top to secure.
- 7. Cut any excess contact paper along the edge of the embroidery hoop, using scissors.
- 8. Hang and enjoy!

Likewise, just like in our homes, our 64 year old building requires many maintenance repairs and upgrades.

Again, our Pastor Eric Markovich, church council and the entire Dr. Martin Luther church congregation, want to express our thanks for these gifts. May God bless the National Slovak Society in the work that it does.
