NSS currently offers four different annuities. Our Preferred 8 currently pays 6.0% interest guaranteed for the first year. The Preferred 5 currently pays 4.0% interest (rate may change quarterly). The Optimum3 is paying 4.25% guaranteed for the first three years. And our single premium immediate annuities (SPIAs) have all kinds of options for payouts.

Annuities are designed for savings towards retirement. A person can start accumulating money by making monthly or annual payments to an annuity. Many people open an account with a lump sum. Some withdraw their interest every month or so. Others are content to let their account grow.






