## Life Insurance and Annuities (4)

This is the last article in a series that has tried to make life insurance and annuities a little easier to understand. Over the past few months, the life insurance articles covered permanent and term life insurance. The annuities covered non-qualified accounts, traditional IRAs and Roth IRAs.

This month we will explore the single premium plan of insurance and Coverdell Educations Savings Accounts (ESA's.)

Single premium life insurance is one of the most powerful life insurance plans to consider. The appeal of this plan is the one-time payment. This makes for a completed gift if a parent or grandparent is buying this plan. For example, a \$25,000 single premium plan for a female, age 5, would run \$2,900 one-time. The beauty of using this plan for young people is four-fold. One, it makes the child a member. Two, provides valued life insurance protection at the lowest possible overall cost. Third, the plan has cash or loan values that can be accessed in the future. And fourth, if the youngster has at least a \$10,000 plan they would be eligible for our scholarship program which could be worth up to \$2,400 (\$600per year for 4 years.)

Sometimes older people use this plan for wealth accumulation or for some smart tax planning. For example, a \$25,000 single premium for a female, age 70, would run \$15,000. Should she pass away her family would receive the death benefit tax free. If she lives, then the cash value would accumulate to more than the premium paid over the next few years.

One other unique aspect of our single premium plan is we allow a three-pay option. This interest-free selection allows a person to make payments on their plan over the next couple of years. The 70-year-old female could pay \$5,000 per year to buy her plan. Or the 5-year-old payments would be \$963.

## Coverdell ESA's (4)

The Coverdell Education Savings Accounts (ESA's) are unique government sponsored programs. These plans are designed to help families accumulate funds for future education costs. Contributions are not deductible; earnings accumulate tax deferred and qualified withdrawals are tax free.

Maximum yearly contributions up to \$2,000 per child up until the child turns age 18. Anyone can add money to the child's account as long as it does not exceed the maximum. Many grandparents like the idea of putting \$100 a month into this plan. Flexibility is the key and once the account is open any amount or nothing may be deposited. But the more you put it the account the better off the child will be in the future.

For example, at current rates, \$2,000 per year (or \$166 per month) for the first eighteen years would have an account value of more than \$54,000 at age 18. Any interest could be received tax-free if the money is used for higher education expenses. While this amount will not pay for the high cost of college it is a great starting point.

A couple of interesting notes. One, if the child does not use this account, it may be transferred to another sibling. Any funds not distributed by age 30 would be taxed the same as any non-qualified annuity. The value of the account from the above scenario would be more than \$90,000 at age 30. Coverdell money can also be used to pay for private high school payments.

Wait to send these different forms of communication until you are parked or at your destination.


