Some Quick Facts About A Roth IRA

Contributions to a Roth IRA are made on an after-tax basis. You can withdraw your contributions at any time and any potential earnings can be withdrawn tax-free in retirement by following the guidelines. You are not required to take distributions from a Roth IRA. Many financial planners and tax professionals believe that a Roth IRA is the way to go since tax rates may go up in the future. A person can have both a traditional IRA and a Roth IRA within the limits.

- Maximum contribution is \$7,000 or \$8,000 if age 50 or older
- No contribution age restrictions.
 You can contribute at any age as long as you have a qualifying earned income.
- Earnings grow tax-free if left to accumulate.
- Principal may be withdrawn before age 59½ without a 10% IRS penalty.
- Qualified tax-free withdrawals if you follow the guidelines.
- No mandatory withdrawals (unlike a Traditional IRA that has RMDs)
- No income taxes for inherited Roth IRAs.

A Roth IRA is easy to open with NSS Life. The minimum is \$90 per month or \$1,000 in the first year. The account is flexible after the first year and any amount at any time may be deposited. NSS Life always recommends that you consult your tax advisor for specific information.

Tips for Overcoming Anxiety and Bullying

About 1 in 3 students will experience an anxiety disorder before they reach 18. By taking a few steps before school starts, you can lay a healthy foundation for your student to thrive. Here are five tips on how to deal with elementary school bullies:

1. Focus on Communication With Your Child

One of the biggest reasons you may have an anxious student on your hands is because of a lack of communication. Some children don't feel safe enough to express what's happening to them.

Since they likely don't have the coping skills needed to deal, they may suffer silently. For that reason, you must focus on communicating with your child. You can't help your child through something you don't know is happening.

2. Normalize Student Anxiety

One thing that can help communication is normalizing student anxiety. In the past, society tended to downplay behavioral health issues like anxiety. You can be the change you want to see by normalizing these issues for the next generation. Explain how every student will get anxious at some point. Then, explain the difference between productive and negative anxiety.

3. Talk About How to Handle Bullies By Identifying Them First

Another thing you need to normalize is bullying. Explain to your child that bullies have always existed, and they always will exist. Bullying does not stop once kids reach adulthood.

4. Research and Discuss Coping Mechanisms

You should instruct your child to stay as far away from the bully as possible. Teach your child how to assert healthy boundaries and stand up for themselves.

5. Schools on Bullying: What Policies Are in Place?

Depending on the situation, you may have to take the necessary steps to escalate the situation to protect your child.





Tips on how to Stay Cool during Summer

While basking in the sunshine is a wonderful thing, extreme heat can be deadly, affecting younger and older people, pregnant women, and those with chronic health conditions.

But there's a lot we can do to protect ourselves and our loved ones from the heat.

1. Be Sun Smart

It's best to avoid going out during the hottest hours of the day, but sometimes that can't be avoided. When out in direct sunlight remember:

- Wear (and regularly reapply) sunscreen.
- Cover your head with a hat.
- Take regular breaks indoors or in a shady area to avoid getting heat exhaustion or heatstroke.
- Wearing light-colored, loose-fitting clothing will also help you to stay cool.

2. Wetter is Better

Heat escapes through the skin, which is the largest organ in the body. So, the more skin you can cool down, the better.

You can quickly cool yourself down by putting your hands and feet in cold water. Wrists and ankles have lots of pulse points where blood vessels are close to the skin, so you will cool down more quickly..

3. Drink Plenty of Water

In hot weather, it's important to avoid caffeine and make sure you're drinking lots of water. If possible, drink isotonic sports drinks to replenish the lost salts, sugars, and fluids.

Both cool and hot drinks will work to keep your core temperature at the same temperature. Consuming hot drinks will not cool you down more effectively than cold drinks. In the heat, you should avoid drinks containing caffeine, including tea and coffee, it's typically best to stick to water.

As you sweat throughout the day, the liquids you are losing need to be replaced to avoid dehydration.

If untreated, dehydration can lead to heat exhaustion. If the person's condition gets worse, you should call 911 for emergency help.

NSS SCHOLARSHIP FOR SENIOR MEMBERS A NATIONAL SLOVAK SOCIETY FRATERNAL PROGRAM

PURPOSE

To encourage our older members to continue their education and to make fuller use of their leisure time.

MEMBER ELIGIBILITY

Any life insurance or annuity member, fifty-five (55) years or older, who has enrolled and successfully completed a continuing education or adult education course. Members may submit up to two (2) applications in one calendar year.

COURSE ELIGIBILITY

Vocational schools, community colleges and universities offer a variety of short-term courses which may include areas like computer training, cake decorating, photography, landscaping, small engine repair, ballroom dancing, etc. This program does not cover courses that assist you to maintain your current full or part-time job. (Example: We will not reimburse life insurance or real estate agents who take continuing education credits to maintain their licenses.)

PROCEDURE

Members should enroll and pay for the course of their choice. Once the member has finished the class, they must submit an application, along with verification that the class was successfully completed, to the Home Office for approval by a National Officer. If the scholarship application is approved, the NSS will reimburse the **full tuition for the course up to, but not to exceed, one hundred dollars (\$100.00).**


