

Reverse Rollover

A reverse rollover is when you move funds from your IRA to your 401k provider. Not all plans allow a reverse rollover but if you were able to do this there are several advantages. The first is stronger legal protections. There is also the possibility of accessing the funds at age 55 should you leave, or your employment was terminated. Another plus to money in a 401k is access, perhaps through a loan. One other advantage is if still working at age 73, a person can defer their 401k RMDs. Budgeting 101

Budgeting or tracking your spending is a good thing to do. This simple process will make you more aware and better able to make smart decisions in the future. The first step is to track all your spending for one month. Get a little notebook and write everything down. Candy, cigarettes, Starbucks, Dairy Queen, gas, etc. The big expenses will not be a surprise (mortgage, car, insurance) since you are already keenly aware of these. But when you total up the month of expenses and see that your Starbucks (\$4.25 per day or almost a \$100 per month may surprise you. Keep all your receipts and track where your money goes.

So here is the 50-30-20 money method of spending and budgeting. Allow yourself 50% of your income for needs (car, home, etc.), 30% for what you want (vacation, dining out, new golf clubs) and 20% for savings. The savings can be a combination of 401k money, IRAs, and a savings account for the short-term. Prioritize debt repayment. Save first then spend. Use some helpful digital tools. Google this last item to get a list of the ten best budgeting tools available and use them.

Unless you want to be in the same place you are one year from now, change your life and try this simple method—it works.



Skalický trdelník

K najznámejšie špecialite oblasti Záhoria jednoznačne patrí tzv. skalický trdelník. Ide o sladkú pochutinu pečenú z



kysnutého
cesta. Aj keď
písomné
dokumenty o
výrobe
trdelníkov
pochádzajú až
zo začiatkou
20. storočia,
jeho pôvod je
pravdepodob-

ne oveľa starší. Na výrobu trdelníka je potrebný drevený valec, nazývaný trdlo, ktorý sa vyrábal najčastejšie z hruškového alebo čerešnového dreva. Naň sa ovíjali pásy pripraveného cesta. Navinutý trdelník sa obalil vo vaječnom bielku, polial maslom a následne ešte obalil nasekanými orechmi a cukrom. Trdlo sa potom pripevnilo nad žeravé uhlíky v ohnisku a pomaly otáčalo, aby sa cesto rovnomerne do zlata upieklo. Trdlá sa otáčali buď pomocou kovovej kľuky alebo sa len mechanicky obracali po štvrtinkách, nakoľko koncové časti trdiel boli štvorhranné. V súčasnosti sa na jarmokoch tzv. trdelníky robia v rôznych príchutiach- škoricové, vanilkové, orechové, kakaové a pod. Skalický trdelník je však výhradne orechový. V roku 2007 získal ako prvý ochranné zemepisné označenie "slovenský výrobok", čím sa určila geografická hranica, kde sa môže vyrábať. Trdelník sa vyrába pri všetkých sviatočných príležitostiach.


